

MORE FOREIGN GUEST WORKERS COMING TO TAKE AMERICAN JOBS

Thanks to Senator Barbara Mikulski!

SENATOR BARBARA MIKULSKI HAS DELIVERED A STUNNING BLOW TO WORKERS IN MARYLAND AND ACROSS AMERICA.

Through her efforts, the U.S. is now poised to more than triple the number of H2B visas for foreign workers seeking jobs in many industries, including and especially the American construction industry, all under the guise of protecting Maryland's seafood industry.

Mikulski's provision will also nullify new regulations requiring better wages, sufficient hours and stricter oversight for H2B workers.

There are only approximately 1,000 workers in the Maryland seafood processing industry overall, and only roughly 200 H2B visa workers.¹

All of which begs the question as to why the need to triple the number of H2B visa workers coming to take American jobs, and to strip away protections so that these workers are nothing more than indentured servants.

Maryland construction workers want a U.S. Senator that will fight FOR more good paying American jobs, not threaten the ones we already have.
